







## Results

- Organizational factors impose forced or planned trade-offs, weighting efficiency, impacting clinical quality
- 2. Trade-off visions aiming to increase quality exist in both the blunt end and the sharp end
- Health personnel's own assessments are often the most prominent vector when thoroughness is weighted
- 4. Factors related to IT systems and ward guidelines lead to trade-offs



#### Discussion


- Efficiency is and will become a crucial aspect in healthcare service delivery
